Chapter 1 Introduction

This regulation establishes policies and procedures pertaining to hunting and fishing on the Pelham Range Reservation.

Chapter 2 References

- a. AR 215-1 (Morale, Welfare, and Recreation)
- b. AR 200-3 (Natural Resources—Land, Forest and Wildlife Management)
- c. Sikes Act of 1960

Requires Federal military lands with wildlife habitat to provide public use of lands, within the installation's restrictions and mission.

- d. Alabama Hunting and Fishing Regulations
- FM-ARNGTC may apply additional restrictions that are outlined herein.

Chapter 3 Explanation of Terms

- a. Pelham Range Reservation: This area encompasses Pelham Range, located approximately 5 miles from Anniston on Hwy 431 North in Alexandria.
- b. Primitive Weapons: Muzzleloaders (any firearm loaded through the muzzle end of weapon and propelled by black powder or its equivalent) .40 caliber or larger, and bow and arrow or crossbows.
- c. Hunt or hunting: Hunting includes pursuing, shooting, killing, trapping, and capturing wild animals and wild birds, and all lesser acts, such as disturbing, harrying, or worrying; placing, setting, drawing, or using any device to take wild animals, wild fowl, or wild birds whether they result in taking or not; and every act of assistance to any person in taking or attempting to take wild animals, wild fowl, or wild birds.
- d. Legal game: The particular game specified at that particular place at that particular time.
- e. Creel or bag limit: The number of legal game animals or fish that an individual is allowed to harvest and/or have in possession on a given day as determined by State, Federal, or Pelham Range regulations.
- f. Baiting: The attempt to take, catch, or kill any bird or animal protected by the State of Alabama or Federal laws or regulations by means, aid or use, directly or indirectly, of any bait such as shelled, shucked or unshucked corn, or of wheat or other grain, deer suckers, deer dust, deer cocaine, lure, enticer, or feed whatsoever. Possession of bait as described herein is prohibited on Pelham Range and will result in a forfeiture of hunting privileges as described in the penalty table.
- g. Driving: Two or more people walking through the woods shouting, clapping hands, or otherwise making noise to flush deer so that they are visible to be harvested
- h. Seining: Seining is the use of a fish net with floats along the top edge and weights along the bottom to capture fish.
- i. Fishing: To take, catch or kill, or, the attempt to take, catch or kill any fish from the waters of this state.
- j. Clearing: To physically turn in one's permit to gun hunt.
- k. Veterans: As defined by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Chapter 4 Policy

- a. Policies and procedures pertaining to hunting and fishing, to include open season, bag limits, and creel limits, are established by the laws of Alabama, the Federal Government as pertains to the Migratory Bird Act, and the provisions of this regulation and are not to be interpreted to permit acts contrary to either State or Federal statutes.
- b. All hunters and fishermen must attend the current Pelham Range Hunter Safety Course (PRHSC) before purchasing a Pelham Range license. The PRHSC is a bi-annual requirement for purchasing a license to hunt or fish on Pelham Range. Classes will be scheduled in advance of the hunting season and

notification will be published in a media source and at the Game Management Office (GMO). Contact the GMO to obtain replacements for lost safety cards.

c. The GMO is located at Pelham Range in building 8416. The phone number is 847-4438. Normal operating hours are posted each year at the GMO.

Chapter 5

5.1 Eligibility

The following persons may hunt and fish on the Pelham Range Reservation in accordance with (IAW) AR 215-1, Chapter 6-1.

- a. Active duty (AD) personnel and their immediate families to include Active Duty Reserve components.
- b. Members of the National Guard and Reserve components (RC) and their immediate families.
- c. Cadets of the Military and Coast Guard academies.
- d. Active Duty members of the Coast Guard.
- e. Retired Military (AD & RC) personnel and their immediate families.
- f. Veterans with 100% service connected disability and honorably discharged. Proof of eligibility is required. Commander may allow veterans with less than 100% disability to receive priority.
- g. Medal of Honor recipients.
- h. Unremarried surviving spouses (and immediate families) of military personnel who died on AD or retired status.
- i. Unremarried former spouses who were married to military members at least 20 years while on AD.
- j. Orphans of military members not adopted under age 21.
- k. U.S. DOD full-time Civilian employees and retired civilian employees and families in the U.S.
- l. Individuals who have distinguished themselves in direct association with or in support of the Army.
- m. Former Prisoners Of War (POW) and spouses of POW's.
- n. DOD contract employees or technical representatives working full-time on FM-ARNGTC.
- o. The general public.

5-2. Identification

Patrons will be identified as authorized patrons prior to using the Pelham Range Facilities. Proof of eligibility must be presented.

- a. The common access card (CAC), issued to active duty military personnel, Selected Reserve, DOD civilian employees (both APF and NAF), and other eligible personnel, will be used for identification purposes.
- b. AR 600-8-14 prescribes identification cards for retired military personnel; Family members; Reserve personnel other than Selected Reserve; and others not authorized the common access card.
- c. DA Form 1602 (Civilian Identification) may be used as identification for retired DA civilian employees and family members of current and retired DA civilian employees. Current and retired DA civilian employees may request issue of DA Form 1602.
- d. Identification for exchange students and au pairs will be a locally developed care of the commander of designee may issue a limited duration letter of access (similar to letters issued for exchange service use by agents to purchase for eligible incapacitated patrons.)
- e. Federal or state issued identification card such as drivers license, state issued ID card, etc.

Chapter 6 Boundaries and Restricted Area

6-1. Boundaries

a. Generally, the perimeter of the Pelham Range Reservation is marked by signs that read "Military Reservation-- KEEP OUT." Entry onto the reservation via any method, other than regularly traveled roadways, without appropriate authorization, constitutes trespassing on a military reservation.

b. Pelham Range Reservation maps are issued by the GMO for hunting and fishing. All persons are required to familiarize themselves with the map and the reservation before hunting and fishing on the reservation.

6-2. Restricted Areas

a. All range administrative and training facilities (buildings, towers, bleachers, cleared range areas, and target areas, etc.) are considered restricted areas and are off limits except for training. This includes entry into or across, by vehicle or foot, all areas of said facilities.

b. Personnel will not enter restricted or off limits areas, which are clearly marked on Pelham Range. These areas are marked on the map and have signs posted at the actual locations.

c. Gun hunting is prohibited within 300 feet of any building, in areas where training exercises are being conducted, or within 2000 feet of the ammunition transfer point and holding area.

6-3. Danger Areas

Dud Impact Areas are located within certain ranges and training areas and are marked on all range and hunting maps. These areas are "off limits" to all personnel, to include shooting into or attempting to take wildlife from these areas. The perimeters of these areas are marked by red and black-on-white signs reading "DANGER! DUD IMPACT AREA--KEEP OUT" and/or signs titled "DUD IMPACT AREA." Entry into these areas is strictly forbidden and is off limits to all persons due to an accumulation of unexploded live ordnance.

Chapter 7 Licenses

7-1. State Hunting License Requirements

All persons, 16 years of age or older, who hunt or fish on the Pelham Range Reservation are required to possess a valid Alabama State Hunting license as a prerequisite to the Pelham Range license. Senior citizens, 65 years of age or older, will be authorized to purchase a combination hunting and fishing license for an issuance fee. Proof of age, residency, and the hunter safety card must be presented when the license is purchased. License holders will be furnished a Pelham Range map and a hunting and fishing regulation. Licensees must be familiar with both before entering hunting and fishing areas. The possession of a Pelham Range license does not automatically guarantee that the holder will be provided an area to hunt or fish.

7-2. Authorization to Issue Licenses/Daily Permits

The GMO is the only activity authorized to issue Pelham Range hunting licenses and daily permits. A Pelham Range license will be issued only to persons who have a valid Alabama State hunting license.

7-3. Application for License

The GMO reserves the right to sell and revoke Pelham Range hunting and fishing licenses on the installation. Eligible persons may apply for an annual hunting license at the GMO. The license year for Pelham Range begins on 1 August and will be valid until 31 July of the following year.

Chapter 8

Permits

8-1. General

- a. All areas of the Pelham Range Reservation are closed for hunting, except as specifically determined or announced by the GMO. All persons who wish to hunt on the Pelham Range Reservation must contact the GMO, in person, for assignment to an area. No permits will be issued over the phone.
- b. Areas to be hunted will be published by the GMO, who will use standard wildlife management practices to ensure the proper management and conservation of all wildlife. Hunting dates will be published before the commencement of the hunting season.
- c. Hunting areas will be assigned according to the hunter's preference, provided the number of hunters in the preferred area does not exceed safety limitations.
- d. Persons specified in paragraphs 5-1 a through 5-1 j will be given first priority for assignment to an area. Persons specified in paragraphs 5-1 k through 5-1 n will be given second priority for sign up. The schedule for first priority, second priority and general sign up for all other license holders will be posted at the GMO each season.
- e. Parents or guardians may sign up their children when school is in session. At all other times, children must accompany parents or guardians when signing up. Each sponsor will be allowed to take one minor at a time while hunting deer or turkey. Sponsor is totally responsible for all actions and violations of minor while on Pelham Range. All sponsors must be at least 25 years old. Only minors age 10 and up may carry a weapon for deer and turkey. Children must be present when the parent or guardian clears the hunting area. If the minor child does not hunt with the sponsor on a given day, the sponsor must clear the minor's permit before going to the assigned area. Children age 16 or older possessing valid State and Pelham Range hunting licenses do have to clear, but do not have to be accompanied by the parent or guardian.
- f. All GMO harvest restrictions and limits will apply to youth hunters during the regular bow and gun seasons.
- g. Military personnel on temporary duty (TDY), alert, or any military commitment are authorized to appoint a representative to sign them up. A copy of the TDY orders signed by the appropriate commander must be furnished stating why the military member cannot be present.
- h. Active duty personnel assigned to another installation whose parents or spouse live in this area may be signed up by afore mentioned for a 1-day hunt only. Individuals must meet all requirements of this regulation before hunting on Pelham Range.
- i. A Pelham Range permit must be obtained for each day's hunt.
- j. Vehicles will not be allowed onto Pelham Range before the designated time each morning of hunting season. Upon assignment to an area, all hunters will proceed by the most direct route to and from the assigned area(s). When pursuing wounded game, entering areas not assigned is prohibited unless specifically authorized by either GMO personnel or the Game Warden.
- k. While hunting, permits will be displayed on the vehicle dash in the windshield, with all information on permit in full view for inspection by law enforcement personnel.

8-2. Issuing

- a. Upland game hunting permits will be limited to the specific type of game that the hunter is authorized to take; i.e., rabbit, squirrel, quail, etc. The permit reflects the areas to which the hunter is restricted. Upland game hunters must present his/her Pelham Range hunting license to GMO personnel before a hunting permit will be issued.
- b. Observers accompanying hunters must be approved by the GMO. They cannot have in their possession any firearm ammunition, or other devices that could be used to take wildlife.

8-3. Clearance

a. Deer hunters will clear areas as follows:

(1) Bow hunters are not required to clear through the GMO unless a deer has been harvested.

(2) Gun deer hunters must clear through the GMO check station for every day they are signed up to hunt. If an emergency situation (death in family, serious traffic accident, etc.) occurs, and the hunter cannot make the hunt, then a phone call will be made to the GMO so that this spot can be cleared for another hunter to use. Failure to clear after hunting or by the specified time the gate to Pelham Range closes will result in a suspension of hunting privileges. Any hunter who has not cleared the GMO after the above specified times would be reported to Range Control, who will conduct a search of the areas. The GMO will make telephonic inquiries into the hunter's whereabouts, as appropriate, before contacting Range Control.

(3) Checking game (deer). Any hunter harvesting a deer on Pelham Range will bring the animal to the GMO before departing the reservation. In the event the GMO is not manned, the hunter shall record the harvest with a harvest report card and deposit the card in the GMO drop box. The hunter will have (7) days to provide the required biological data and jaw bone to the GMO.

8-4. Special Permits

The following special permits will be issued by the GMO. Individuals using special permits are not allowed to possess any type of weapon or photographic equipment without authorization.

a. No scouting permits will be issued.

b. Guest permits will be issued by the GMO. Only 1 time per season may a licensed hunter bring a guest. Guest will be allowed during deer season only, until the last hunting day in December. The guest must hunt in the same area as sponsor. The sponsor will be totally responsible for all actions and violations of the guest. The guest must meet all state requirements. Deer harvested by a guest shall be counted towards the licensed hunter's seasonal deer limit at Pelham Range.

8-5. Special Hunts

The following special hunts may take place on Pelham Range at the discretion of the Commander:

a. MWR upland and MWR Deer hunts.

b. Wounded Warrior and Hunters with Physical Disabilities hunts.

c. Hunting over unbaited food plots is permitted for Wounded Warrior and Hunters with Physical Disabilities hunts.

Chapter 9 Inspections

9-1. Inspection of Licenses

All hunters (except children under age 16) are required to carry an Alabama and Pelham Range hunting license on their person. These documents must be presented for inspection, upon request of Security guards, MP's, State or Federal Game Wardens, Range Control, or GMO personnel.

9-2. Inspection of Game Bags

Creel and game bags will be readily available for examination upon request by Security guards, State and Federal Game Wardens, MP's and GMO personnel.

9-3. Inspection of Vehicles

All vehicles are subject to search by the State or Federal Game Wardens. Game Management personnel are permitted to conduct visual checks, and if they have reason to be suspicious, will call the State or Federal Game Warden to search the vehicle.

Chapter 10

Weapons and Ammunition

10-1. Shotguns

- a. Shotguns are the only authorized firearms for hunting, except as outlined in paragraphs b, c, d, and e below.
- b. The over-and-under type shotgun and rifle combination is prohibited.
- c. Shotguns larger than 10 gauge are prohibited.
- d. No more than a total of three shells will be inserted in any shotgun, to include the chamber, when hunting migratory fowl (i.e., ducks, geese, and dove) and deer. Plugs incapable of removal through the loading end of a magazine will be used when hunting migratory fowl and deer. Externally adjustable plugs are prohibited.
- e. Gun deer hunters will not possess, on their person or in a vehicle, ammunition other than shotgun slugs on the day of a shotgun hunt.
- f. Only No. 4 shot or smaller will be used while upland game hunting. Ammunition other than what is specified herein is prohibited. Exception: For turkey hunting, No. 2 shot or smaller will be used. Possession of buckshot or rifle slugs is prohibited while hunting upland game.

10-2. Primitive weapons

Only muzzle-loading firearms propelled by black powder, pyrodex, or an equivalent are permitted. Muzzleloaders are allowed for Deer and Turkey hunting only. Weapons must use a single solid slug or ball of .40 caliber or larger when deer hunting. Black powder pistols are illegal.

10-3. Bow and Arrow

- a. The bow and arrow is an authorized weapon for hunting deer, turkey, and upland game.
- b. Compound bows, long bows, recurve bows, and crossbows are authorized but must be in accordance with the Alabama Hunting and Fishing regulation.
- c. All weapons, except the compound bow, longbow, and recurve bow transported in vehicles on Pelham Range property will be in a secured gun case. A secured gun case must be a commercial case with a securing device such as a zipper or lock. Weapons transported in any other fashion such as sock tie cases or wrapped in cloth will not be considered secured. Additionally, cases with securing devices must be fully zipped or locked to be considered secured. Crossbows will not be transported in a cocked position.

10-4 Rifles

- a. Rim-fire rifles are not authorized for use on Pelham Range.
- b. Possession of any firearm or ammunition while authorized to hunt with bow and arrow is prohibited.

Chapter 11

Hunting with Dogs

- a. Hunting with dogs is authorized for upland game, i.e., squirrel, rabbit, quail, providing it does not interfere with other hunters. Only bird dogs are allowed during deer season.
- b. The hunting of deer with dogs and the training of dogs to hunt deer are prohibited.
- c. All dogs used for hunting must be vaccinated against rabies. Dogs brought on Pelham Range for hunting purposes must wear a current rabies vaccination tag and the hunter must have in his/her possession written proof of such vaccination.
- d. Dogs will not be dismounted until a vehicle is parked.

Chapter 12 Restrictions

a. During the hunting season, all hunters must wear a minimum of 500 square inches of hunter's orange consisting of a vest and hat. Hunter's orange must be of a solid color and visible from any angle. Wearing just a hat or just a vest will not be considered enough hunter's orange. 500 square inches of hunter's orange must be worn at all times except as follows:

(1) Deer hunters, hunting from a tree stand that is at least 12 feet high or higher, may remove the vest and hat.

(2) Bow hunters are required to wear hunter's orange, as specified above.

(3) Hunter's orange is not required for dove or turkey hunting.

b. Taking game from a field or cover that has been baited is prohibited, this includes food plots.

c. Hunting will occur during daylight hours only.

d. Hunting from or carrying a loaded weapon in a motor vehicle is prohibited. No shooting is permitted from vehicles, roadways, or other public access areas.

e. Motor vehicles will not traverse cross-country or through wildlife openings. Hunters will park privately owned vehicles only in the area they have been assigned to hunt. Vehicles must be parked completely off paved roads.

f. Possession, use of, or being under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs by any person while hunting is prohibited. NOTE: First offense will be the permanent revocation of hunting privileges. Law Enforcement personnel will be notified of persons suspected of use or in possession of alcoholic beverages or drugs.

g. Photographic equipment will be allowed with the following restrictions; no pictures will be taken of any building, range, or other facility, to include training area boundary markers or signs.

h. It shall be unlawful for any person to take or catch, by any means or device, deer, whether dead or alive, from the waters of Pelham Range.

i Any violator of the provisions of wildlife laws, rules, and regulations shall not have as a defense that the person killing, taking, or possessing wildlife was mistaken as to species, sex, age, or size.

j. Indiscriminately discharging any firearm on or in any public access area, e.g., Federally owned, National Guard licensed, leased, and/or operated, area within the legal boundaries of Pelham Range is prohibited. This includes unloading muzzleloaders.

k. The use of any type of trap, snare, pitfall, deadfall, hook, or other device, except authorized firearms or bows, is prohibited except by the GMO or authorized representative through coordination with the GMO.

l. Any person who makes use of, or has in his/her possession, any wildlife or wildlife parts that have been killed or taken in any manner contrary to these rules and regulations shall be punished in like manner as the person who killed or took such wildlife.

m. Permanent tree stands are not allowed on the Pelham Range reservation. Portable or lock-on tree stands are allowed. Tree stands may not be placed in hunting areas before the day of the hunt. If Range Control, Game Wardens, or GMO personnel find stands, they will be confiscated and taken to the GMO for disposal. Hunters hunting from tree stands are required to wear a safety harness.

n. Hunters must carry and use a flashlight during the hours of darkness while walking in or around hunting areas.

o. Violation of terms or conditions of permit is prohibited.

p. Deliberate pollution of streams, wetlands, creeks, or lakes. NOTE: Hunters are not authorized to use fording sites, unless instructed by the GMO Forging site use is for authorized training only.

q. Removal of any property or natural feature is prohibited.

r. Removal, walking over or disturbing any plants designated in an endangered species area is prohibited.

s. Possession of turkey and /or locator calls is prohibited before the opening day of turkey season.

t. "Driving" of deer is prohibited.

u. Hunters and fishermen will use only roads designated by the GMO to drive and park along. These will be displayed on a map at the GMO.

v. No flotation devices will be allowed for use on Pelham Range. This includes but is not limited to boats, belly-boats, inner tubes, etc.

w. Any road or roadway upon which GMO allows driving and/or parking along is considered a "Non-Shooting" road. Gun hunting will not be allowed within 50 yards of said roads.

- x. Spears are prohibited.
- y. The use of game cameras by hunters on Pelham Range is prohibited.
- z. Unauthorized search, excavation or the collection of cultural artifacts on Pelham Range is prohibited.

Chapter 13

Fishing

13-1. General

- a. Areas. Fishing is permitted in Cane Creek on Pelham Range.
- b. Permits to fish. Fishing at Pelham Range shall be approved or prohibited annually by the Commander and posted at the GMO. The GMO is the only activity authorized to issue Pelham Range fishing licenses and daily permits. Individuals must have in their possession a valid State or County and Pelham Range fishing license. No permits will be issued over the phone.
- c. Licenses. All personnel fishing (except children under age 16) are required to purchase a State/County fishing license and Pelham Range permit. Both must be presented for inspection upon request by GMO personnel and/or State/Federal Game Wardens.
- d. All children 15 years old and under must be accompanied by an adult while fishing.
- e. Night fishing is not authorized on Pelham Range.
- f. When approved annual fishing dates will be posted at the GMO.

13-2. Restrictions

- a. The taking of any species of fish other than by ordinary hook and line, artificial lure, troll, or spinner, as allowed by State law, is prohibited.
- b. The use of set poles and setlines are prohibited, unless continually monitored. Once monitoring is stopped, line(s) must be removed from the water. No jug or trotline fishing is authorized on the reservation.
- c. Seining for fish is prohibited on Pelham Range.
- d. The use of fish traps and snatch hooks on the reservation is prohibited.
- e. The use of bow and arrows, crossbows, spears, or gigs for the taking of fish is prohibited.
- f. Individuals fishing or walking along the banks of ponds and streams will not deliberately disturb or molest nesting birds, waterfowl, or their young. Possession of the young is unlawful.

Chapter 14

Harvest Management

- a. The following will be the requirements for harvest management of deer on Pelham Range:
 - (1) The annual deer hunting harvest restrictions shall be posted each season in the GMO.
 - (2) All points on bucks will be one inch in length to count toward the required total on each side. These will be measured according to Boone & Crockett (B&C) standards. Measuring diagram will be posted in the GMO.
 - (3) All game will be retrieved from the field, whether it meets harvest restrictions or not.
 - (4) If a hunter is authorized to remove a deer from Pelham Range without all the data having been collected (such as a deer to be mounted), required data will be provided to the GMO within (7) days after harvest. It is the hunter's responsibility to provide this data.
 - (5) Any non-management buck deer harvested will be claimed by the hunter as his/her next allowable buck.

Chapter 15

Appeal Process

Individuals having hunting/fishing privileges suspended or revoked may appeal for reconsideration. Appeals will be submitted, in writing, to the FM-ARNGTC- DTPMS Division Chief for review to insure the decision to suspend/revoke hunting or fishing privileges was made in accordance with this publication.

Chapter 16

Penalties for violating Hunting and Fishing Rules

a. Any act that could cause loss of life or limb could result in a permanent loss of hunting privileges. All other violations of Alabama State law, Range hunting/fishing regulations, and any other rules/restrictions communicated to person's hunting/fishing on the reservation will be dealt with individually. Suspensions resulting from hunting violations will be imposed immediately at the time of infraction and not at the convenience of the hunter. Hunters who commit an offense in the last two weeks of the season will be penalized at the beginning of the following hunting season.

b. Any violation with a suspension of less than 90 days will be considered a minor offense. All violations will remain on hunter's or fishermen's record permanently.

c. For a hunter performing community service projects on Pelham Range in lieu of a suspension. This will be done at a rate of 25 hours work / 2 weeks of suspension. This will only be an option for the first offense. The above option is only available with DTPMS approval. For the listing of the penalties and offenses, refer to table 1 on pages 9 and 10.


17. Audits

a. A complete audit of all fund activities will be accomplished biennially, upon change of the Game Management Officer, or as determined by the Adjutant General and/or State Property and Disbursing Officer.

b. On site audits will include verification and inventory of all fund-owned equipment.

c. The game management activities at Ft. McClellan Army National Guard Training Center are a state function and are therefore subject to state audits by the Examiners of Public Accounts and the Property Inventory Division of the State Auditor's Office.
