Duty Position Job Description/Criteria:

Serves as the assistant to the State Simulations Director for various training equipment assigned to the AL ARNG. Responsible for providing commanders and Soldiers with operational knowledge and expertise in support of weapons training, doctrine, utilization, and strategy to support individual training. Assists with coordinating training using Training Aides, Devices, Simulators, and Simulations (TADSS), based on required tasks and availability of devices. Operates various TADSS assigned to the AL ARNG. Inventories and reports equipment as required. Provides knowledge and expertise to individual unit personnel. serves as the subject matter expert for TADSS trainers, related weapons, and various components used in training. Researches data from a variety of sources to provide information on doctrine and utilization strategy to applicable trainers based upon TRADOC training guidance. Reviews and recommends revisions of lesson plans, POIs, etc., to ensure individuals and units receive training on the most up-to-date regulatory procedures. Is an expert with, frequently operates, and trains units using the Engagement Skills Trainer (EST 2000 II). Frequently uses systems to include RFMSS, TS-MATS, DAMPS. TAMIS, DTMS, as well as other various training and administrative platforms.

Instructs personnel in rifle, pistol, and automatic rifle marksmanship. Explains and demonstrates weapon safety, firing positions, fundamentals, and techniques of marksmanship. Instructs personnel in nomenclature, disassembly, operation, stoppages, and immediate corrective action for small arms weapons. Is familiar with, can explain, and administer range safety regulations and standards. Observes personnel during firing to ensure safety and provides corrective instruction, to improve marksmanship. Scores field firing results to include target detection, range estimation, firing positions, and other marksmanship principals. Assists with all aspects of firing range operations to include radio communication, as well as coordinating safety, security, weapons, ammunition, personnel, and vehicles. Uses basic computer skills and knowledge of Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Adobe PDF. Submits and maintains training reports. Possesses the ability to read, interpret, and implement U.S. Army manuals, regulations, and other publications. Coordinates with unit trainers to plan, organize, and execute ReARMM training requirements. Works well under pressure, is a self-starter, and demonstrates reliability and responsibility at all times.
