Ensure that monthly sensitive item inventories and monthly cyclic inventories are conducted, maintained, and signed by the Unit Commander. Assist in maintaining the unit Class IX registers. Track unit OR rating and vehicle status. Assist in preparing quarterly Unit Status Report (USR), briefing materials, ammunition requests, training site requests, and other reports and/or requests as directed by the Commander and/or AGR OIC. Responsible for accomplishing the Commander's plan and program to attain the unit's supply accountability and mobilization readiness objectives. Operates the Global Combat Support System-Army (GCSS-A) to maintain automated accountability and reporting for equipment accountability. Attend additional skill identifier (ASI) required schools, and training courses conducted by the National Guard Professional Education Center (NGPEC) and or Joint Forces Headquarters as required. Will become knowledgeable of and perform duties in accordance with all state and federal laws and Army regulations governing hazardous materials handling and storage as well as hazardous waste storage and disposal. Will comply with state and federal regulations governing the procurement of recycled material and waste reduction. Will also maintain records and provide information regarding environmental actions. Works closely with the Commander and Battalion S4 during Command Supply Discipline Program (CSDP) inspections and assists the Commander with his program. Performs other duties as assigned. Works under the direct supervision of the command team or the senior full-time support Soldier. Last minute notice of travel is possible and required along with extended work hours and weekends as necessary by the command to meet mission requirements.
